## What Is Wealth?



"Thou dost make him to rule over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under his feet" (Psalm 8:6).

The Christian's Wealth

Above all else, God is concerned with our *attitude*. The abundance or the lack of money does not affect our relationship to Him—only our attitude does.

The Christian must be able to trust God in every circumstance, believing that He loves us and gives us only the stewardship we can handle without being tempted beyond that which we can withstand. Because of its tangibility, money is a testing ground before God of our *true* willingness to surrender self to Him.

Wealth is neither *moral nor immoral*. There is no inherent virtue in poverty—there are dishonest poor as well as rich. God condemns the misuse of or preoccupation with wealth — not the wealth itself. The production of wealth is implied in Romans 12:5, 8 where the gift of giving is listed as a spiritual gift.

## God's Will in Finances

## 1. Stewardship

The key to understanding God's will in finances is the proper understanding of *stewardship*. By Webster's definition, a steward is "one who manages another's property." We are merely stewards of God's property while we are on earth. He can choose to entrust us with as much or as little as *He* desires, but in no case will we ever take ownership.



If we Christians can accept that role as stewards and manage God's resources according to His direction, God will continue to entrust us with even more. But why would He entrust more property to one who began to hoard and who felt he was the owner? Moreover, until the Christian acknowledges God's total ownership, he can't experience God's direction in financial management.

### 2. How God Uses Finances

God uses money in a Christian's life to direct him. If we are seeking His wisdom, He promises to supply it. But understand that God's will is not always coincidental with our wishes. God will often withhold funds in order to teach us a lesson. Too often Christians strike out on their own without clear direction from God. Not only does that violate the principle expressed in Matthew 4:7, which states, "Jesus said to him, 'On the other hand, it is written, you shall not tempt the Lord your God,' " but those who do it regularly have also not truly accepted God's wisdom as superior.
